

#### Cannabis legalization information

As of October 17, 2018, cannabis is legal in Canada.

Yukon schools will ensure students have the information they need to make healthy choices and stay safe. Drug and alcohol education, including cannabis, continues to be part of Yukon's school curriculum.

The legal age to use, possess, cultivate or purchase cannabis is 19 years of age. Adults must ensure that children under 19 do not have access to their cannabis or cannabis plants.

Educators will continue to have grade-appropriate conversations with students to teach them about the risks of cannabis use, as well as the use of alcohol and illegal drugs. The use of cannabis continues to be prohibited on school grounds and during any school related activity or field trip.

If you suspect your child is having problems with drugs or alcohol, you can talk with us about getting help from a guidance counselor or alcohol and drug services counselor or contact Mental Wellness and Substance Use Services directly at 867-456-3838.
